MINUTES of the AUGUST 21, 2017 Meeting of the Homestead Valley Community Council 3:00 p.m. at Yucca Mesa Community Center

Meeting opened with the Flag Salute at 3:04 p.m.

Treasurer's Report: Approved

- **1. Guest Comments** on items not on the agenda, none
- **2. Election of Officers** We need equal representation from the 4 communities, in order to nominate and vote for officers.
- **3. SB County Fire Dept** Chief Scott Tuttle July calls: Johnson Valley 2; Landers/Flamingo Heights 36; Pioneertown 2; Yucca Mesa 28.

Wildfire season still upon us. County resources returned from wildfires in California and out of state. USFS firefighter from San Bernardino killed when part of a tree fell on him fighting a fire in Montana. The recent rash of fires in the southern foothills of San Bernardino Mountains caused by an arsonist. Sheriffs there have license plate readers, a key factor in investigation and capture.

- 4. SB County Sheriffs Dept Capt Jeff Joling or Lt Mike Barta unable to attend
- 5. CalFire Chief Tony Jones unable to attend
- **6. Jim Schooler** Field Representative for State Senator Jean Fuller unable to attend. Betty to send him update on Scenic 247 campaign.
- 7. Continuing Review of items discussed with Supervisor Ramos during the Feb 20 HVCC meeting
 - Scenic 247: Sarah Kennington spent much effort searching for a Landscape Architect. We found out we actually do not have to hire one, **thanks** to Jim Schooler (Senator Jean Fuller's field rep) and Chris Scott (field rep for Assemblyman Jay Obernolte) who got this confirmed. We will be relying on Caltrans for guidance.

The Coordinator of Scenic Highways expected to visit in late September or October. Meanwhile, we resume photography and the visual assessment for County to use in proposal for Scenic status. There are major threats to the scenic corridor.

• Homestead Valley Community Plan: no notice when the draft plan will be published.

The County General Plan was to be approved by Sept 2018.

Chuck Bell in Lucerne Valley was told, that even *before* the General Plan is approved, if an applicant comes with a project with major land-use changes inconsistent with our community action plans and the pending zoning and land-use maps, that the "project won't be looked on favorably."

- Hauled Water Ban: The statewide ban, on building permits for properties which rely on hauled water, remains in effect. So the Pacific Legal Foundation has a renewed interest in this issue. They are looking for cases where a property owner can show damages from being denied a building permit, and a written proof of denial.
- Solar Moratorium: The moratorium on industrial solar and wind projects was not renewed. The Board of Supervisors PUBLIC HEARING for the final draft of the REC Element was held August 8. Large attendance. Sometime after 6:00, the Supervisors voted with the construction unions request to remove the sec-

tions of the Element that gave desert communities the most protection from industrial solar development.

8. Ord Mountain Solar Project and Siena Solar Project - Two major installations proposed in the North Lucerne Valley with an Edison substation larger than these projects need.

9. Cleanup at Giant Rock, Saturday, September 8

Landers Association, Blight Sites, Mojave Desert Land Trust, and BLM co-hosting. Residents who heard the story on Z107.7 are making cleanup runs at Giant Rock on their own.

10. Report on LV-JV and Morongo Basin MACs

MB MAC- Dark in August. Sept 11 speaker Pat Flanagan, presentation on Sand Transport. October 9 Meeting with Caltrans

LV-JV MAC- In July, speakers from the Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District discussed air quality problems created by Ord Mtn and all industrial solar projects, including the issues raised in Pat Flanagan's Sand Transport presentation. Developer responsibility for monitoring dust miles downwind is an overlooked necessity. A letter to the Supervisor in opposition to Ord Mtn was approved. No meeting in August...
