Measure K: measure brought forward by Red Brenan Group to limit elected supervisors to part-time and one term passed by voters in Nov of 2020. County challenged constitutionality of the measure and won in court. Red Brennan Group appealed and the tentative ruling indicated they will side with RBG. County is exploring all options moving forward. If there are no options, my one term will end December of 2024, and your next supervisor will be part-time and one term (pay will be \$22/hr).

8. State Senator Shannon Grove - Representative Dominic Heiden speaks. The Governor signed a \$300 billion 2022-23 budget. We were pleased that it included funding for firefighters.

We are approaching the end of the 2022 legislative year. All bills have to be passed on or before August 31.

Senator Grove has three bills which are still in the running:

- 1. SB 1619 to highlight the untenable practice of shutting down clean oil production in California while backfilling California's oil needs with oil from countries with a gross lack of environmental or human rights standards.
- 2. SB 1195 to increase satellite services for veterans by making use of underutilized space at the California veterans homes.
- 3. SB 1183 which would create the California Imagination Library, a concept brought to us by the Dolly Parton Foundation to increase childhood literacy and get books in the hands of children.

Thank you for providing the update. We have been reviewing this, particularly as it relates to the information and outstanding issues that Karen provided prior to her retirement. In response to the issues raised by the City of Barstow, we would propose to exclude from the plan those parcels within their sphere of influence as highlighted below. We also still need to work on something to address concerns raised by Edison. In addition, we are recommending a 1-mile mitigation area off the highway (200 feet existing v. 20 miles proposed).

We believe this is the best compromise to keep this effort moving forward. I am very happy to discuss further and look forward to continuing working with you on this plan.
